zurich workshop on afrikaans linguistics 4-5 October 2021

Context

In October 2021, Zurich university organises a workshop on the linguistics of Afrikaans that will be the culmination of an entire year devoted to this interesting language, which will feature linguistic seminars as well as language courses. It is the first event ever in Zurich solely dedicated to Afrikaans linguistics.

With over seven million native speakers, predominantly in southern Africa, Afrikaans is the fifth largest Germanic language. Although important work has been done regarding the history and the social and political aspects of Afrikaans, the study of *its structure* is still relatively uncharted territory especially compared to that of related languages.

This workshop aims to show that Afrikaans lends itself to interesting insights for theoretical linguistics and to bring together experts from southern Africa, the Low Countries and elsewhere in front of a Zurich audience.

Four plenary talks will be held by experts on Afrikaans and its theoretical implications. A further set of workshop sessions will be available for more contributions. The workshop will be concluded by a round table session. Our plenary speakers are:

- Theresa Biberauer (University of Cambridge)
- Andries Coetzee (University of Michigan)
- Timothy Colleman (Ghent University)

To allow for people from all backgrounds to be introduced to the merit of Afrikaans as a subject for linguistic theory, the working language will be **English**.

General information

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Organisation

The programme encompasses two days with plenary talks, open call contributions and a round table discussion at the end of the second day. The round table panel consist of the invited speakers and will link the previous sessions and establish common grounds and discuss insights on the structure of Afrikaans and theoretical linguistics.

Call for Papers

We welcome proposals for **20-minute presentations** that discuss research on an aspect of the structure of the Afrikaans language, connecting it to general or theoretical linguistics, be it from a



synchronic or diachronic perspective. After each 20-minute presentation, there will be 10 minutes allotted to questions and discussion.

Abstract

Send in your abstract (maximum of **500–2000 characters**, including spaces and interpunction, but not counting bibliography) as a PDF document via the registration form on our congress website (t.uzh.ch/11u).

The deadline for sending in your abstracts is **June 1st, 2021**. You can also register to attend the congress without presenting (see Registering).

Selection procedure

The criteria for selecting the presentations for the open call sessions are:

- 1. fit to the theme and quality of the abstract,
- 2. gender and diversity balance.

You will be notified whether your presentation has been accepted by the end of June, 2021.

Further practical information

The workshop organisation does not offer any reimbursement of expenses for travel or hotels. However, the workshop is free of charge to encourage as many people as possible to attend, including those who will not be active participants. We do offer a luncheon and conference dinner on the second day to all **active** participants, as well as a reception ('Apéro riche') as a chance to mingle on the first day to all participants, active or not. It is therefore important to register (both active participants and other attendees), to ensure comestibles and seating facilities.

Attendants who are relying on documentation to apply for funding at their own institution, can ask the workshop organisers for a confirmation of their attendance or of the acceptance of their abstracts, as the case may be.
